You are an archaeologist who has dug up some Anglo-Saxon artefacts (a bit like Sutton Hoo), what could be inside? Who did the casket belong too? Describe what you have found in a diary entry.	Write a description for an Anglo-Saxon house like a modern estate agent would write. Include a picture, sale price, and a detailed description.
Come Dine With Me: design a menu for an Anglo Saxon feast. Include descriptions of each course.	Make a model of an Anglo Saxon artefact- it could be an object used in their home, for their clothes, or for warfare.	Create a poster about Alfred the Great, who was he and why was he so great?	Create your own Sutton Hoo helmet/mask using whatever materials you have. You could also decorate it using tin foil or buttons. Look at the one found at Sutton Hoo for an example. (It can be any size).
Write a motivational speech, poem or song to encourage soldiers before a battle. Extra star awarded if you perform it to the class.	Research an Anglo-Saxon God and make a poster about them. Present your ideas in an eye-catching way.	Write a secret message for your teacher using Anglo-Saxon Runes.	Grand Designs: Design and build an Anglo-Saxon house. An adult can help you with this.
